What's New?

The DC Council has implemented several changes to DCs lobbying laws

The changes are effective October 1, 2026



The Changes?

- Change 1 – Increased the standard registration fee from \$350 to \$500
- Change 2 – Increased the non-profit lobbying registration fee from \$100 to \$250
- Change 3 – Removed registration and reporting exemption from 501(c)(4) non-profit organizations



The Changes?

- Change 4 – Increased the late and non-filing fines and penalties from \$100 per day up to 60 days to \$200 per day up to 60 days
- Change 5 – Included weekends and holidays in the 60-day fine period

Who is a Lobbyist?

Anyone who directly communicates with D.C. legislative or executive officials to influence laws or decisions.

- A lobbyist is any person who engages in lobbying.
- “Lobbying” means communicating directly with any official in the legislative or executive branch of the District government with the purpose of influencing any legislative action or an administrative decision.

D.C. Code § 1-1161.01



LOBBYING IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

What Counts as Lobbying?

Example:

- A neighborhood safety group, *Ward 7 Watch*, hires *DC Voice Advocacy (DCVA)* to oppose a bill reducing penalties for certain felonies. The Ward 7 Watch pays DCVA \$2,500 to contact councilmembers to propose alternative sentencing that reserves current penalties for dangerous offenders.
- Since both the group and the firm meet the \$250 threshold, both must **register** and **report** with BEGA.

Advocacy Vs. Lobbying

- While all lobbying is advocacy, not all advocacy is lobbying
 - **Advocacy:** Supporting a cause publicly (e.g., organizing rallies, posting on social media).
 - **Lobbying:** Directly contacting D.C. officials to **influence** decisions or laws.
- Whether your contact with D.C. government is advocating or lobbying, sharing the public's opinions on matters are welcome. Just remember that if you were paid \$250 or more for your advocacy within a three-month reporting period for your contact with D.C. government, you may have to register!

Lobbying Defined

What is not “Lobbying”:

11

- Personal testimony or legal representation in formal hearings
- Responses to written requests from agencies
- Status inquiries
- Public testimony at hearings
- Media outreach (TV, radio, newspapers)
- Political party communications

- D.C. Official Code §1-1161.01(32)(B).

LOBBYING IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

Lobbying Defined Continued

What is not “lobbying”:

- **Grassroots communications:** The act of asking the public to contact officials concerning issues and legislation.
- A non-profit supports credit reform legislation and encourages the public to speak with District officials in support of it to tackle the issue of inflation.
- Members of the public who communicate with District officials in support of this bill are engaging in lobbying, because they are having direct communications with District officials with the intent to influence legislation, *but* they do not have to register as lobbyists because they are not receiving compensation. The non-profit would not need to register as a lobbyist in this effort alone. If a registered lobbyist did not have any direct communications with public officials regarding this matter, then it would not have to report this activity on its lobbying activity report.

LOBBYING IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

Lobbying Defined Continued

What is other activity that would require registration with BEGA:

- **Procurement communications:**

- Communications with District officials regarding questions about government contracting or a purchasing decision are not “lobbying”
- There must be an *intent to influence legislative action or administrative decision*.
- Example:
 - A company hires a firm to assist it in influencing the contents of a District RFP and submitting a bid proposal to the District. The company wins the contract and the firm interfaces with a District agency regarding the status of the contract award and later regarding invoice issues. None of these communications/interactions with the District amount to “lobbying,” because there is no intent to influence legislative action or an administrative action. Status checks and questions regarding invoices do not amount to intent to influence.
- EXCEPTION: Contracts more than \$1 million (during a 12-month period) require Council review and involve legislative action (through the introduction of a resolution either approving or disapproving the proposed contract). See D.C. Official Code § 2-352.02.

LOBBYING IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

- **Lobbying Defined Continued**
- **Scheduling communications:**
 - Communications with District officials to set up a meeting with a public official.
 - This alone is not “lobbying,” and would not need to be disclosed in lobbying activity reports.



FILING REGISTRATION REPORTS

Who is Required to Register?

Anyone who is **paid or spends \$250+ in any 3-month period** to influence legislation or decisions.

- Both the **lobbyist** and their **client** must register.
- Registration is due **by Jan 15** each year, or **within 15 days** of becoming a lobbyist. Failure to register as required by this section shall result in a civil penalty.

Registration Fee – Updated 2026

The District of Columbia Council passed the 2027 Budget Support Act of 2026, amending Lobbyist Registration Fees and Late Filing Fees;

- The Registration fee for lobbyist is now \$500;
- If you are a nonprofit organization OR a lobbyist who lobbies solely for tax exempt 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(4) nonprofit organizations, the registration fee is now \$250;
- The electronic payment system accepts credit cards;
- A check If a check is submitted, it should be payable to the DC Treasurer;
- k will not be considered submitted until it arrives at BEGA and receipt is date stamped;
- Registration will not be certified until the fee is paid.



Civil Penalty for Failure to Register or File Activity Reports-Updated*

D.C. Code § 1-1162.32

-
- Notwithstanding § 1-1162.21 and except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, any person who willfully and knowingly violates any of the provisions of this part shall be fined not more than \$5,000, or imprisoned for not more than 12 months, or both.
 - Any person who files a report or registration form required under this part in an untimely manner shall be assessed a civil penalty of **\$200 per day up to 60 days (calendar days)** that the report or registration form is late. The Board may waive the penalty imposed under this subsection for good cause shown.
 - *As a courtesy, BEGA will send notice to all registrants to remind them of upcoming due dates for Activity Reports.*
 - Each day an activity report or registration is late, a registrant or client shall be fined **\$200 a day, up to \$12,000.**

Exceptions for Registration & Reporting

- A public official, or an employee of the United States acting in his or her official capacity;
- A publisher or working member of the press, radio, or television who, in the ordinary course of business, disseminates news or editorial comment to the general public; or
- A candidate, member, or member-elect of an Advisory Neighborhood Commission



FILING ACTIVITY REPORT

Activity Reports

D.C. Code § 1-1162.30

-
- Each registrant shall file with the Director of Government Ethics between the 1st and 15th day of January, April, July, and October of each year a report signed under oath concerning the registrant's lobbying activities during the previous quarter. If the registrant is not an individual, an authorized officer or agent of the registrant shall sign the form.
 - A registrant shall file a separate activity report for each person from whom he or she receives compensation.

Activity Reports

D.C. Code § 1-1162.30 (continued)

-
- The reports shall be public documents and shall be on a form prescribed by the Director of Government Ethics and shall include the following:
 - (A complete and current statement of the information required to be supplied pursuant to §1-1162.29;
 - Total expenditures on lobbying broken down into the following categories:
 - Office expenses;
 - Advertising and publications;
 - Compensation to others;
 - Personal sustenance, lodging, and travel, if compensated;
 - Other expenses;
 - Note: BEGA will send reminder notices to file.

Activity Reports Continued

D.C. Code § 1-1162.30

-
- Each expenditure of \$50 or more shall also be itemized by the date, name, and address of the recipient, and the amount and purpose of the expenditure;
 - Each political expenditure, loan, gift, honorarium, or contribution of \$50 or more made by the registrant or anyone acting on behalf of the registrant to benefit an official in the legislative or executive branch, a member of his or her staff or household, or a political committee or political action committee established for the benefit of the official, be itemized by date, beneficiary, amount, and circumstances of the transaction; including the aggregate of all expenditures that are less than \$50;
 - Each official in the executive or legislative branch and any member of the official's staff, including personal and committee staff, who has a business relationship or a professional services relationship with the registrant shall be identified by name and the nature of the business relationship with the registrant.

Activity Reports Continued

D.C. Code § 1-1162.30

- The name, position, and agency or office of each official in the executive or legislative branch and member of the official's staff with whom the registrant has had written or oral communications;
- A precise description of the subject matter, including the title of any bill, proposed resolution, contract, reprogramming, or other legislation, of all written or oral communications related to lobbying activities;
- Each person whom the registrant has given compensation to lobby on his or her behalf; and all bundled contributions.

- Please Note that if there are ANY outstanding fees, you **CANNOT** file an activity report until the fee has been paid.

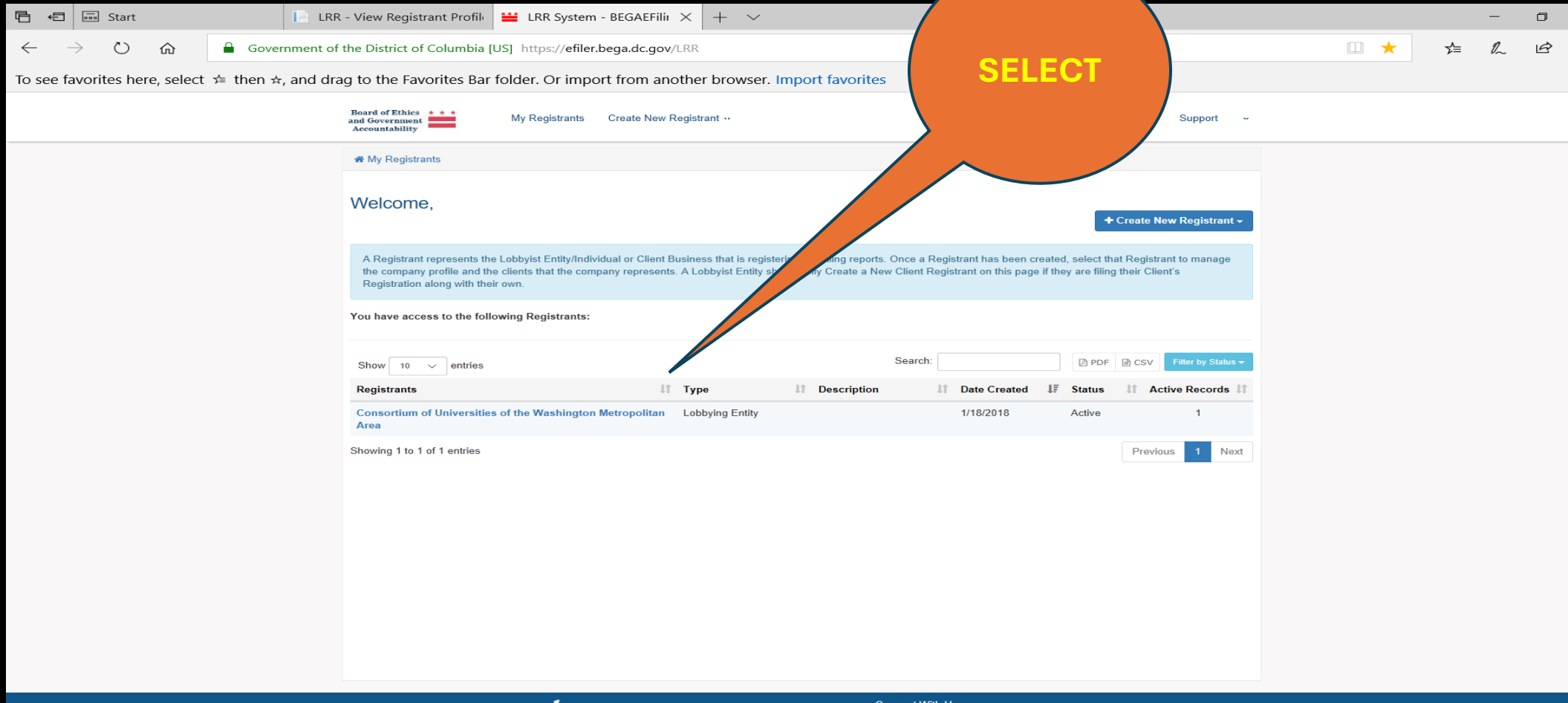

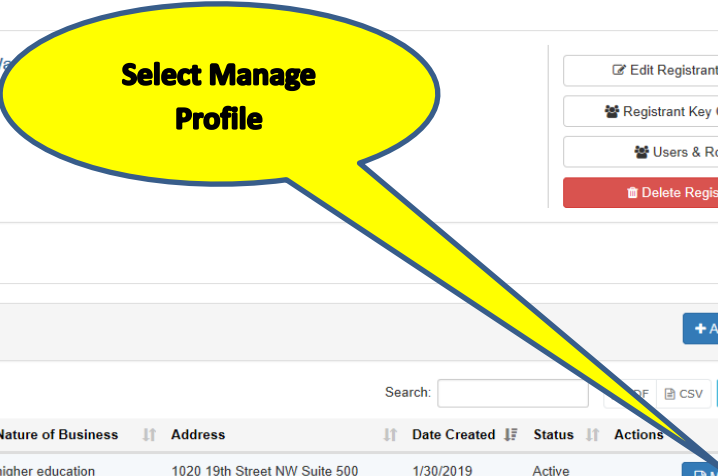
